

> Group members receive information on Conference Actions that affect A.A. unity, health, and growth.

District Meetina

> D.C.M.s take information about A.A. worldwide back to their districts and G.S.R.s report to their groups on the deliberations of the Conference.

G.S.R.s and D.C.M.s attend district committee meetings and also go to the area assembly







Structure of the Conference U.S. and Canada





The Group Conscience



Just as it is important for a GSR to express it's group's conscience at the District and Area level, it is equally as important to return information back to the group, thus allowing the group to become informed

Group Conscience vs. Informed Group Conscience

Group Conscience - the collective conscience of group members Informed Group Conscience implies pertinent information has been studied, and all views have been heard before the group votes

Just as in our own individual recoveries, sometimes the decision we choose isn't always the "right" one. But, if that decision was made after consulting other alcoholics and ultimately with God, even if it wasn't "right", that decision is ultimately the best.

Same goes for the informed group conscience.
