







Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio and films.









TRADITION OF THE MONTH

Principle: Attraction



Our relations with the general public should be characterized by personal anonymity. We think A.A. ought to avoid sensational advertising. Our names and pictures as A.A. members ought not be broadcast, filmed, or publicly printed. Our public relations should be guided by the principle of attraction rather than promotion. There is never need to praise ourselves. We feel it better to let our friends recommend us.


We agree that when we speak with or interact with the general public, we always maintain personal anonymity. We think A.A. should avoid dramatic or shocking advertising. Our names and pictures as A.A. members should not be broadcast, filmed, or publicly printed. Our public relations should be guided by the principle of attraction rather than promotion. (Meaning we will say what we do and allow people to decide for themselves if they want to join us.) We never need to praise ourselves. We feel it is better to let our friends recommend us.





What is a D.C.M.

The heart of AA is the group, which elects a generaservice representative (G.S.R.). The G.S.R. attends districmeetings that are made up of the groups in that district The G.S.R.s elect a district committee member (D.C.M.). Thus, the D.C.M. is the vital link between the group! G.S.R., and the area service structure, including the area delecate to the General Service Conference.

Where does the D.C.M. come from? G.S.R.s in each district usually elect their D.C.M.s. The qualifications for a good district committee member are not complicated: background in A.A. service work that

Roles

GSR

- Share anything you feel the District should know about what's going on with your home group (e.g. issues, events, service initiatives, etc)
- Share with the District which discussion topics does your home group (or you) want held at the District, Area or General Service Conference
- Share with the District any motions your home group would like to make to the District, Area or General Service Conference
- Ask for support with providing service in your community

DCM

- Share feedback and needs from home groups/GSRs with the Area
- Provide service opportunities to the home groups that fall in between intergroups, geographically
- Support home groups in carrying the message into the community by providing literature and service opportunities
- Connect home groups so they can share experiences and learn together
- Inform home groups about the Delegate's
 Questionnaire and provide a Report back after
 the General Service Conference
